# RULES GOVERNING APPLICATIONS FOR THE AWARD OF AN IAC FELLOWSHIP, FACI(M)

#### (Master Movie-Maker / Master of Audio-Visual Arts / Master of Film & Audio-Visual Arts)

- 1) This distinction is granted by the IAC Council for outstanding attainment in movie-making or audio-visual arts.
- Applications should be made in writing to the Fellowships Officer on the official form, enclosing £25 non-returnable administration cost.
- 3) Applicants must be full individual or principal family members of the IAC of at least five continuous years. Associate members, affiliated clubs or groups are not eligible.
- 4) To qualify, applicants must have accumulated at least five points as follows:
  - A Five Star Award (Gold Standard Award prior to 2006) in the IAC International Film and Video Competition will be worth one point.
  - An IAC Diamond Award (International Standard Award prior to 2006) in the IAC International Film and Video Competition will be worth two points.
  - A Gold Award in the UNICA Competition will be worth two points. (In this case all additional points must be won in the IAC International Film and Video Competition)
  - Two A-V sequences which have each won two International awards will be worth one point providing that one of
    the four international awards was via the Peter Coles / Geoffrey Round A-V Competition. This method of
    accumulating points will need to be repeated five times. (10 sequences and 20 awards are required in total, with a
    minimum of 5 of these awards being gained via the Peter Coles / Geoffrey Round A-V Competition.)

In addition, the portfolio of work earning the five points must include at least one IAC Diamond Award/International Standard Award winning film/video *or* one UNICA Gold Award *or* at least one overall winner of the Peter Coles / Geoffrey Round A-V Competitions.

Documentary evidence of these awards may be required.

- 5) Each movie or A-V sequence must have been made in the name of the applicant or with the applicant in the role of Director. Competition entries by a club, group or society will not count.
- 6) No entry or part thereof may be used by any other applicant.
- 7) No single entries can be counted twice to accumulate points from different competitions.
- 8) To ensure this is adhered to, the Fellowships Officer will keep a full and careful catalogue of all applications.
- 9) If an applicant is successful the Fellowship will remain in force only as long as the holder possesses a currently valid IAC subscription receipt.
- 10) Successful applicants may style themselves as one of the following, appropriate to the specialism demonstrated in the portfolio of work earning the qualifying points:
  - Master Movie-Maker
  - Master of Audio-Visual Arts
  - Master of Film and Audio-Visual Arts
- 11) It is the responsibility of the Fellowships Officer to ensure that all rules and regulations are scrupulously observed. Also that all reports and correspondence are treated with due expediency and confidentiality.
- 12) In the event of any dispute the Fellowships Officer's decision is final.
