The Chairman thanked all those who had entered movies for the competition. Twenty three entries had been received. A question was raised why one club or individual had got two entries in the show, whilst others were not shown. The Chairman replied that it was entirely the judge's choice on the formation of the programme.

There being no further business, the meeting closed at 12-26 p.m.

The Burnley Festival moved to a new home this year - Burnley Youth Theatre - and yet again the teamwork of the members ensured another highly successful event on Saturday, March 8th



After so many years meeting at Padiham Town Hall, the Venue Manager, Keith Widdup, and the organising committee were anxious to ensure that the high standards set for the previous 37 Festivals were maintained. They need not have worried - the event went off with hardly an hiccup. The plaudits came in from those attending who enjoyed the comfort of the theatre style seating, the quality of the Special Guest's presentation, as well as the high standard of this year's entries.



The refreshment area, which was not so large as at the town hall, became a little congested as the 90 members attending dashed to the buffet 'feast' for which the ladies of the Burnley club have built up such an admired reputation. The queue caused some problems but attention will be paid to improving the catering lay-out before next year's Festival.



Special Guests for the Festival were Michael Gough (FACI -M) and his wife, Linda (FACI & current President of the IAC) who assisted for the judging part of the proceedings. As the theme for his presentation, Michael chose "Looking for Inspiration" and truly inspired us as he described and illustrated the development of his film making skills over the years.



Newton's Column

**John Newton

Many years ago I was invited to present a film show for a group of people who were members of a local Church Social Group. Originally I was scheduled to ‘perform’ in the Church itself, this made me somewhat nervous, since it was a venue more suited to the Sacred than the Super 8. However, because of what I can only surmise was ‘Divine Intervention’, my venue shifted to the vestry, which although being further away from the Heavenly part of the building and nearer to the ‘other place’ was considerably warmer.

Due to the cramped conditions, presenting the show proved to be a tricky business. In a very crowded room, more suited to Marriage than movies. Working in the ‘Dark’ I had some difficulty lacing up and identifying the various films and it struck me forcibly that it would have been much easier if all I had to do is shove a video cassette into a slot.

Certain advantages present themselves in the use of a video projector compared with the traditional Cine machine. The most obvious one being the ease of loading the tape cassette, this of course assumes that you have got the right one in your hand. No china-graph ‘Title’ on a length of white leader however, if you do pick up the wrong one. Another advantage was that generally one Video Projector will do the job, no doubt many of you will remember those club competition evenings in the cine days when the back of the room resembled the massed ranks of the Royal Artillery before the battle of ‘El Alamein’. This of course was not due to individual mistrust of the other machines but more to the variation in the precision of the sound heads by different manufacturers. Hence that well worn phrase heard on many club nights “Well it sounded alright on my machine”

If it did nothing else the eventual adoption of Video Projection created some space at the back of the room, leaving the responsibility for ‘Carrying the Can’ or should I say ‘Carrying the Cassette’ to one operator.

Another advantage of Video Occurs to me, in that the business of Rewinding’ films becomes much easier and convenient. If like me you ran the show continuously and left the ‘rewinding’ to the morning after the ‘night before’ then the prospect and simplicity of rewinding a ‘Tape’ as apposed to the film, is appealing.

Some Video Projectors were obviously intended for small rooms, the throw of the image requiring the Machine to be positioned about mid way in the room. Another plus for the Video Projector was the ‘silent running’ inherent in the system that does not depend on sprockets and gear wheels, having said all this, there is of course one factor which tended to limit the rapid substitution of Video for Cine projection, this being relatively higher costs involved.

In the halcyon days of Standard & Super 8 the possession of a cine camera, led invariably to the acquisition of a projector, how else could you see the results of your filming. The Camcorder was designed to work with a television set and as a result there is no prospect of mass market for video projectors, with the ensuing drop in the price. However advancing technology did no doubt, play some part in bringing video projection within the reach of most cine clubs eventually.



Mersey Ten Competition 2014

Hosted by Keith Widdup



Burnley Film Makers were the hosts for the IAM North West Region's Mersey Ten Competition on Saturday, April 26th, held at the Burnley club's base in Higham Village Hall on the edge of the beautiful Ribble Valley countryside.

Some twenty entries competed for the coveted awards and sixty members turned up from N.W. clubs to be part of the day. This was the first time the Burnley club had hosted the competition and the club's Secretary, Keith Widdup, did a masterful job as M.C. with N.W. Chairman and Competitions' Officer, Jim Whalley, welcoming guests and presenting the awards at the end of the afternoon.

The quality of entries well matched the technical standard set in previous years and covered themes ranging from the horticultural, historical, humorous and poetic to the somewhat macabre! It was great to see several entries coming in from Northern Ireland, one of which gained a 'Very Highly commended' award and covered a special commemorative day and tribute to the members of the U.S. forces based in Northern Ireland during World War II.

Highly supported by the audience vote was James Chalmers's film "Epitaphs" and his "Hitler in Liverpool" entry received a 'Commended' certificate. (Swan)

John Rickard (Burnley) was 'Highly Commended' for his film on the "Four Seasons", but the premier award by both Judges' and by the Vic Williams Trophy audience vote went to David Crossley (Burnley) for his excellent production "Lifetime", which is a philosophical and thought-provoking presentation of a man and his garden.

Ken and Carol Wilson of Phase 4 had kindly done the earlier judging, but were regrettably unable to be present on the day. Their job had not been easy considering the standard and number of entries but their verdict on best film "Lifetime" was echoed by the audience vote on the day. Job well done!

As we have come to expect, the organisation of the event met the Burnley club's enviable reputation. For the first time, the event took place on an afternoon rather than an evening - an experiment which the N.W. Region may well wish to continue with future Mersey Ten Competitions.
